Columbia University Facilities & Operations is here 24 hours a day, seven days a week supporting the University. Whether we're planning a campus renovation, breaking ground on a new building, maintaining our award-winning buildings and grounds or keeping our campus safe, our staff helps keep the University moving forward.

We currently have two Architectural student casual position's available, based on all aspects of the design process for the new Manhattanville campus in the Manhattanville Development Group department, which is responsible for the development, design and construction of complex projects and smaller renovations for the Columbia University expansion in West Harlem.

Sample responsibilities include:

The student casual will perform architecture/design related tasks, including compiling data and preparing drawings for distribution; assisting in compiling architectural plans; assist in conducting preliminary studies to obtain information as to space and design requirements; research and information gathering for use in various projects.

Requirements:

Enrolled in a graduate or undergraduate degree program in Architecture (minimum of 3 years enrollment for undergraduate applicants); familiarity with construction means and methods; some design experience through internships or summer work preferred; excellent computer skills (some AutoCAD experience preferred); excellent written, and oral communication skills; quick learner and ability to handle multiple tasks concurrently; strong initiative and good attention to detail; ability to work full time (35 hours/week) during the months of June through August.


