Entrance Elevation

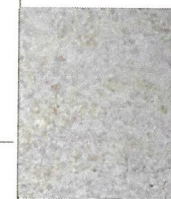


Site Plan - Broad

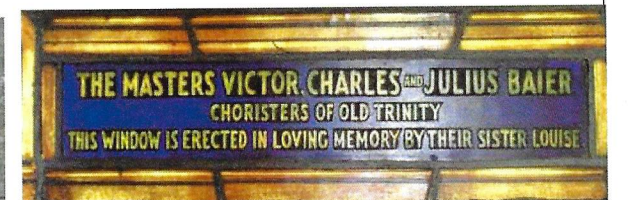
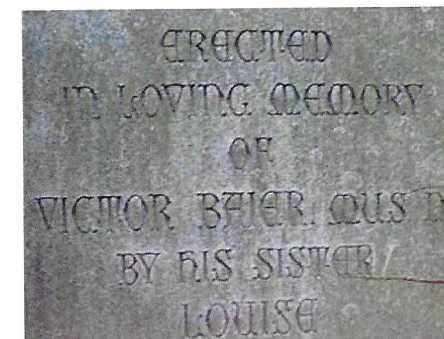
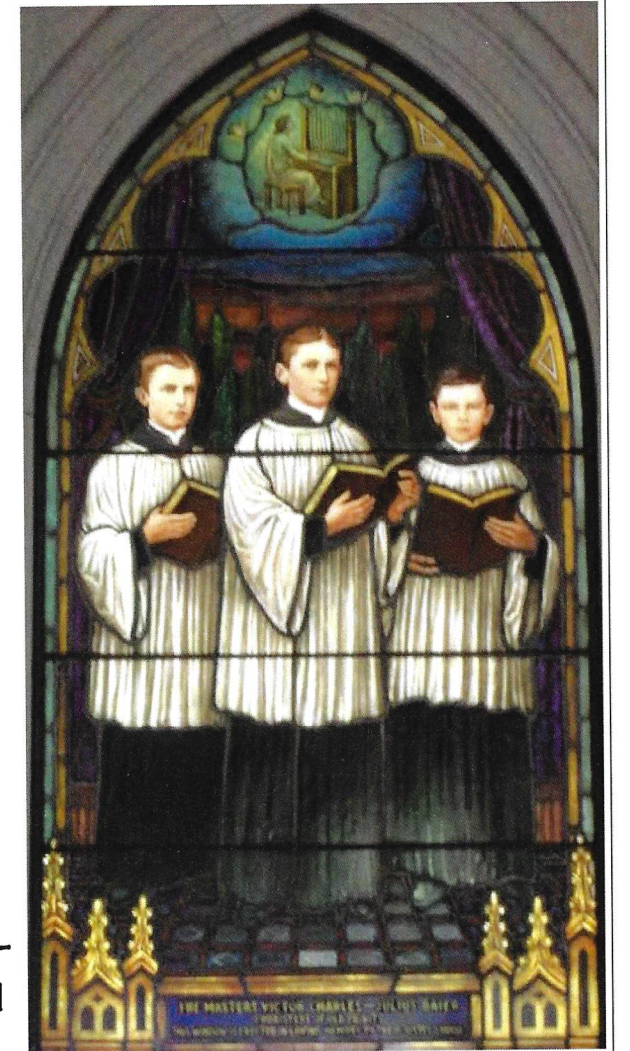
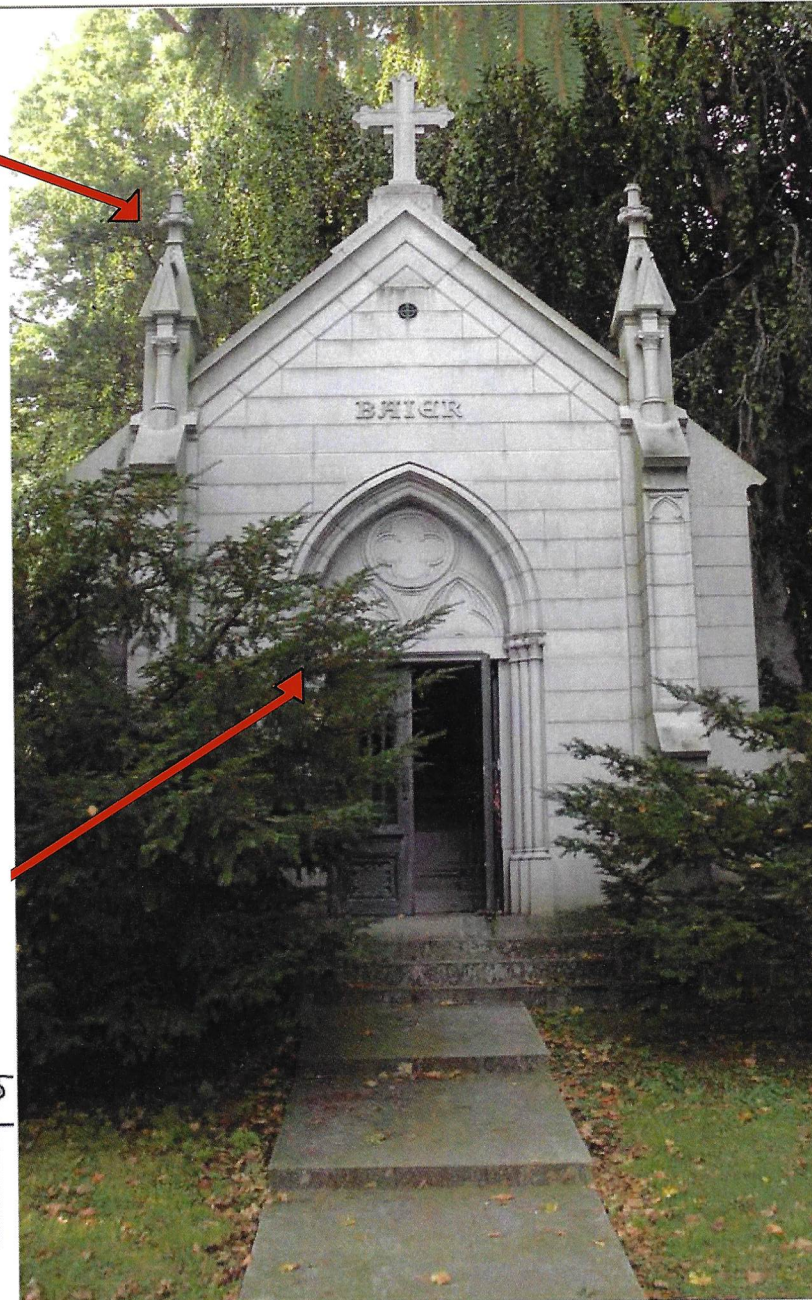
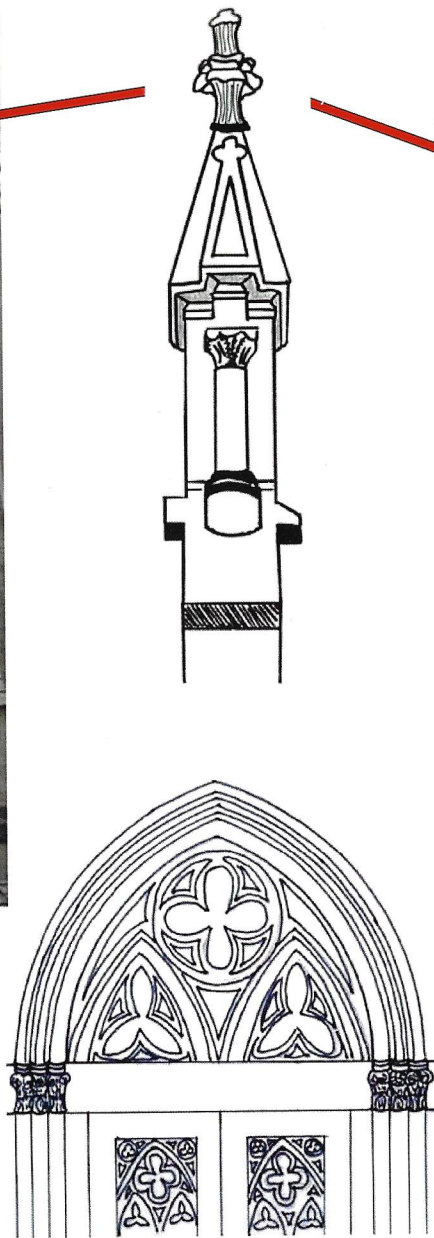
- All three brothers (Victor, Charles, & Julius) were in the Trinity Chapel Choir.
