Student Retention and Graduation Rates

AICP Exam Pass Rate

To become a certified planner, members of the American Planning Association (APA) must meet certain education and experience requirements and pass the American Institute of Certified Planners (AICP) Exam. The pass rate is the percentage of test takers who pass the examination within 3 years of graduating from a master's program.

Employment Rate

The Employment Rate measures the percentage of MSUP graduates who obtain planning positions or elect to pursue an advanced degree within one year of graduation.
